





What we have funded

The Northern Health Foundation exists to support the life changing, and often life-saving, work of Northern Health. By efficiently managing the process for donations and philanthropic support, the Foundation provides much needed funds in the areas of teaching, training and research; education; capital works; and the purchase of medical equipment within Northern Health.

Continuous Glucose Monitoring System – The Northern Hospital (\$1,875)

The Continuous Glucose Monitoring System (CGMS) enables health professionals to gain insights that can lead to better diabetes management. The purchase of this monitoring equipment will provide comprehensive information for patients and clinicians regarding glucose levels. The Australian Macedonian Romano Inc. has donated \$2,000 to support the purchase of this equipment.

Tilt Wheelchair – lan Brand Nursing Home (\$2,953)

The lan Brand Nursing Home at Bundoora Extended Care Centre required an additional tilt wheelchair to support the 30 per cent of residents who have limited mobility. The Chair allows patients to be reclined during the day and allows greater movement by staff to outdoor facilities. Funds have been donated by two individuals to purchase this equipment.

Hand Held Pulse Oximeter – Craigieburn Health Service (\$841.50)

A Pulse Oximeter allows staff to monitor patients oxygen saturation levels and pulse rates. The Craigieburn Sporting Club has donated funds to support the purchase of this equipment.

Portable Observation Monitor – Craigieburn Health Service (\$3,299.50)

This piece of equipment will improve efficiency and facilitate increased time to treat patients in the Outpatients Department at Craigieburn Health Service.

Patient Hoists – Broadmeadows Health Service (\$8,115.25)

This patient hoist will assist with rehabilitation patients being moved from wheelchairs to dialysis chairs. The Lalor Bowling Club and Rotary Bundoora have donated funds to purchase this patient hoist.

Tilt Chair – The Northern Hospital (\$3,295)

This tilt chair will assist with the increasing number of stroke patients who have a lack of mobility. The chair will allow the patient to be reclined and allow staff to move the patient more freely. Funds to purchase this equipment have been raised by the Epping Fundraising Group.

Cardiology Research (\$18,112)

The Northern Health Board have approved a Fellowship in Northern Health's Cardiology Department. The Fellowship is supervised by Professor Bill Van Gaal and is funded by Medtronic Australasia.

Thermo Scientific Forma Freezer (\$12,900)

This low temperature freezer will assist the Northern Health's Cardiology Department to support various cardiovascular trials. The freezer will allow for storage of specimens such as blood and is funded from the Northern Health Annual Dinner.

What we have funded

Shiavello Sleeper Chair – Special Care Nursery (\$7,590)

The Shiavello Sleeper Chair will enable mothers to stay with the child overnight in the Nursery. These chairs has been funded by the Turi Trust Foundation.

Northern Health Small Research Grants (\$25,000)

Northern Health clinicians, nurses, allied health professionals and students are invited to apply for one of two Northern Health Small Research Grants per annum. The grant allows staff and students to apply for up to \$5,000 per application to help fund a research project that is consistent with the strategic priorities of Northern Health's research agenda. Funds have been raised to support this program via the annual Northern Health Research Dinner.

Continuous Glucose Monitoring System – The Northern Hospital (\$1,875)

The Continuous Glucose Monitoring System (CGMS) enables health professionals to gain insights that can lead to better diabetes management. The purchase of this monitoring equipment will provide comprehensive information for patients and clinicians regarding glucose levels. The Australian Macedonian Romano Inc. has donated \$2,000 to support the purchase of this equipment.

Tilt Wheelchair – lan Brand Nursing Home (\$2,953)

The lan Brand Nursing Home at Bundoora Extended Care Centre requires an additional tilt wheelchair to support the 30 per cent of residents who have limited mobility. The Chair allows patients to be reclined during the day and allows greater movement by staff to outdoor facilities. Funds have been donated by two individuals to purchase this equipment.

Hand Held Pulse Oximeter – Craigieburn Health Service (\$841.50)

An additional Pulse Oximeter is required at Craigieburn Health Service, the equipment will allow staff to monitor patients oxygen saturation levels and pulse rates. The Craigieburn Sporting Club has donated funds to support the purchase of this equipment.

Portable Observation Monitor – Craigieburn Health Service (\$3,299.50)

The Outpatients Department at Craigieburn Health Service require a portable observation monitor. The department currently borrows from other departments, causing inefficiencies and less time with the patient. Craigieburn Sporting Club has donated funds to support the purchase of this equipment.

Patient Hoists – Broadmeadows Health Service (\$8,115.25)

The Broadmeadows Dialysis Unit requires a patient hoist to assist with rehabilitation patients being moved from wheelchairs to dialysis chairs. The installation of this hoist will decrease the number of patient falls and staff injuries. The Lalor Bowling Club and Rotary Bundoora have donated funds to purchase this patient hoist.

Tilt Chair – The Northern Hospital (\$3,295)

Unit B at The Northern Hospital requires a tilt chair to assist with the increasing number of stoke patients who have a lack of mobility. The chair will allow the patient to be reclined and allow staff to move the patient more freely. Funds to purchase this equipment have been raised by the Epping Fundraising Group.

(c) Comparative amounts

Where necessary the previous year's figures have been reclassified to facilitate comparisons.

(d) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised in accordance with AASB 118: Revenue. Income is recognised as revenue to the extent that it is earned. Unearned income at reporting date is reported as income in advance.

Amounts disclosed as revenue are, where applicable, net of return allowances and duties and taxes.

Note 1 - Financial Reporting Framework (continued)

(e) Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised on a time proportionate basis that takes into account the effective yield on the financial asset.

(f) Donations and Contributions

Donations from Northern Health represent income earned and donated to the Northern Health Research, Training and Equipment Trust in support of delivering the mission and vision.

Donations - other represents income earned from corporate associates, benevolent organisations and general donations.

(q) Grants

Grants are recognised as income when the entity gains control of the underlying asset in accordance with AASB 1004 "Contributions", irrespective whether conditions are imposed on the trust's use of the contributions.

Contributions are deferred as income in advance when the trust has a present obligation to repay them and the present obligation can be reliably measured.

(h) Goods and services tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority, in which case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense.

(i) Donation Expense

Donations Expense represent disbursements made to Northern Health to fund operating projects and capital equipment.

(j) Payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. The normal credit terms are Net 30 days.

(k) Financial assets

The classification of financial assets between current and non-current assets depends on the nature and purpose of the assets and is determined at the time of initial recognition.

(I) New Accounting Standards and Interpretations

The AASB has issued new, revised and amended standards and interpretations that have mandatory application dates for future reporting periods and which the trust has decided not to early adopt.

The expected impact of these accounting standards issued but not yet operative at 30 June 2016 are assessed as having no material impact on the financial report.
